Soaring Energy Costs (SEC)

The 'revived' SEC should stand for 'Soaring Energy Costs'. Under Labor electricity prices have soared by 25%. The Labor State Government promised to return energy generation to public ownership, yet the SEC remains a vague \$1 billion pledge with no independent costings, and their first 'SEC' project is a minority share into an existing private project.

Victoria's Housing Crisis

I recently held a roundtable discussion with Real Estate Agents in Bendigo to discuss Victoria's housing crisis. Labor State Government's taxes, red tape and regulation are destroying Victoria's housing market, and both landlords and tenants are suffering. Property owners are leaving the market in droves, forcing people out of the rental market and onto the social housing waitlist. According to the REIV the total number of rental properties has dropped by nearly 22% since 2020, as rental properties disappear from the market it reduces the number of houses available and drives up rent. The vacant land tax is also adding significant costs for property developers wishing to subdivide and build new homes, further reducing the number of new houses available.



Victoria Police on Strike

The Labor Government's neglect of Victoria Police is putting the safety of Northern Victorian communities at risk, as police numbers dwindle and crime rates continue to rise.



Regional Infrastructure

The Nationals continue to fight for a fairer share of state government funding in regional areas, to build key infrastructure projects including the Shepparton Bypass, Kilmore Bypass and the new Yarrawonga Bridge.

Shadow Minister for Health, Georgie Crozier MP and Wendy Lovell MP recently joined me in Bendigo to visit Bendigo Health, Monash University School of Rural Health, and St John of God Bendigo Hospital.


Diwali Festival

Committees

Flood Inquiry

I am a member of the parliamentary committee undertaking an inquiry into the State Government's response to the 2022 Victorian Floods that impacted 63 local government areas. In Rochester over 900 homes were flooded, and people are still living in caravans. The Committee's final report is due in June 2024.

'Con' Games

The Liberals and Nationals called for an Upper House inquiry following the Labor State Government's decision to cancel the Commonwealth Games. According to State Government department estimates, cancelling the Games will cost Victorians more than half a billion dollars.

Batting for Business

An inquiry is being held into the Allan Government's flawed WorkCover legislation, thanks to the Liberals and Nationals. Over \$1.3 billion of taxpayer funds have already been used to prop up the broken Scheme, and businesses have been slugged with an average 42% rise in insurance premiums.

Save our Bacon

Auditor General Reports

The Auditor General's Annual Financial Report of the State of Victoria: 2022-23 states: Debt rose again this year at a pace faster than revenue and economic growth... The government have not laid out a plan for when and how the state will pay down existing and future debt.

The Premier has chosen to ignore these warnings, signing Victoria's 'debt sentence' committing to a \$3.6 billion contract to commence the \$125 billion+ Suburban Rail Loop, despite soaring debt, rising interest rates, increasing labour and material costs, and inflationary pressures. Before the 2018 election Labor promised to reduce expenditure on contractors and consultants, but a recent review by the Auditor General revealed that between 2018-2022 State Government spending on consultants and contractors increased by 47%, with over half a billion spent on consultants, and over \$11 billion on contractors!

Victorian Ombudsman Report

The Victorian Ombudsman recently conducted a review of the politicisation of the Victorian public service which revealed a major lack of transparency, stating:

We uncovered rushed and shoddy recruitment practices, overuse of direct appointments often involving former ministerial staffers, executives fearful of providing 'frank and fearless' advice, and the marginalisation of public officials around keynote projects.
